SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) provides effective support services to students with disabilities in order to maximize their academic strengths. Advisors work with students to develop individualized accommodation plans designed to meet the learning needs of each student.

How and when do I make arrangements for accommodations?

Contact the SSD office as early as possible prior to your program start date to begin the process. You should meet with an advisor four to six months before you start your program.

What kind of support is provided?

All types of documented disabilities are supported at NAIT. Accommodations are based on a student's disability, documentation, and academic needs.

Depending on the nature of your disability and documentation, SSD supports may include exam accommodations, tutoring, assistance with note taking, academic strategy sessions, alternate format materials, assistive technology, or other services.

Advisors also meet with students who suspect they may have learning disabilities, and will arrange for appropriate screening and assessment.

STUDENT COUNSELLING

NAIT counsellors are dedicated to enhancing student success through the provision of short-term academic and personal counselling services. Individual counselling sessions are confidential, and are free to all students currently registered in a NAIT program.

When should I see a counsellor?

Our counsellors are experienced professionals available to help you work through personal or academic concerns. Common challenges include:

- adjusting to student life
- exam anxiety
- depression
- stress
- relationship or family issues
- learning difficulties
- study skills.

What should I expect from a counselling session?

Counsellors will ask you to describe your concerns. Counselling goals will be established and we will work together to develop a course of action to meet those goals. We will assist you to find resources outside of NAIT if your problem is beyond the scope of our services.

TUTORIAL SERVICES

Drop-in tutorial centres are located on Main, Patricia and Souch campuses, offering free tutoring services to any NAIT student who presents an ID card. The professional tutors provide support to students who need extra help with coursework.

Individual peer tutoring services are also available for a low fee.

When should I see a tutor?

When you need additional assistance with course content in areas such as math and sciences, drop in to the tutorial centre.

If you require a peer tutor, meet with the Tutor Coordinator at Main Campus in Room A172B and she will try to match you with a current student who can help.
